Crime Analysis for Problem Solvers 60 Small Steps

Like most crime analysts, you probably think of your job in rather modest terms. You do not solve crimes single-handed. Nor do you take the lead in setting departmental crime-fighting priorities. Instead, you crunch data for those who do the "real" work of finding better ways to arrest criminals. You respond to requests for the latest statistics on burglary or car theft from beat officers and sergeants. You map crime for weekly meetings so that the lieutenant knows where to demand more effort. And you compile monthly statistics that others need for their reports. In other words, you sit in the back seat while others do the driving, asking for your help only when they need it.







Approval and data quality processes, offer assistance, show examples of the why


Clerical







If logistically possible, analysts should be located within the detective bureau


Starting point: Offer to assist in search warrant preparations


Why? Working together enhances investigations through applied technical processes, crime series/patterns identification, known and most likely offenders; expands analyst mindset; and the analyst begins to become an accepted member of the team

CATALYTIC CONVERTER INFORMATION

The rash of catalytic converter thefts that we have been experiencing is not a new problem. Thieves are stealing catalytic converters because of the three rare <u>metals</u> found inside of them – platinum (current value \$1278/oz), rhodium (current value \$6008/oz), and Palladium (\$395/oz). The average converter only contains approximately 1 to 2 grams of the metals, a maximum of about 7/100th of an ounce. Metal recycling companies will pay anywhere from \$25 to \$150 apiece for converters. Replacement costs for a catalytic converter can run upwards of \$1300.

Our target vehicles are Toyota's (city-wide), whose converters are only attached by means of four bolts which are easily sawed off, as opposed to most other vehicles models where the converter is actually welded to the exhaust system. Access to the catalytic converter is from under the car and they can be removed within minutes. We have had 11 thefts reported in the last six weeks.

Residential Burglaries—Possible Series

SUSPECTS: 1 F/X, 1-2 MX, NFD SUSP VEH: older sedans and SUVs with paper plates

On Wednesday, December 19, at 1055 hours, an unknown suspect kicked in the side garage ped door at 15 Hacienda. The homeowner interrupted the burglary and the suspects fled. Witnesses stated that there were potentially two subjects in the fleeing vehicle (DR 18-17524)

This crime may be linked to several prior residential burglaries earlier this year

Unique M.O. factors to be aware of (please note in reports):

- Entry/attempted entry through door pry (especially garage side doors)
- Alarm systems disabled (they are possibly targeting houses with alarms)
- Primary losses included jewelry and cameras
- Typically one female and two male suspects in various vehicles (likely rentals)
- Suspects typically ring doorbells numerous times before entry
- Common shoeprint: "zig-zag" pattern (pictured right)






Learning from Unsuccessful Attempts

The Chula Vista, California Police Department was aware that the city's building boom could worsen the residential burglary problem. The new houses were intended for affluent couples who would be out during the day when burglaries were reast likely to happen. The police, therefore, decided to examine the effectiveness of existing security precautions to see if any of these could be built into new homes or suggested to homeowners. Cathy Burciaga, one of the department's crime analysts, compared completed burglaries with unsuccessful attempts for an 18-month sample of 569 homes in the city. This indicated that deadbolts should be installed on both the side and front doors of new houses. Interviews conducted with 250 victims and 50 burglars revealed that not one burglar had tried to enter a house by breaking a double-glazed window. This led to the recommendation that all windows in new housing be double-glazed and meet strict forced-entry standards.


Between March 2rd and June 22rd a series of robberles were identified within the North Richmond area. Fifteen (15) incidents were identified with similar M.O. factors. Suspects are a group of Black male juveniles ranging in age from 6 to 20 (most between 10 and 17). The suspects approach the victims and physically assault them by hiting and kicking them, also in several cases they used sticks/boards and rocks. In five (5) cases they used handguns and in one (1) case they used a toy handgun. Suspects are targeting primarily Hispanic males fraveling alone and no foot. Crime Analysis Case Study Field Interview



SYNOPSIS:

On 12/26/2018, at 1724 hours, three unknown suspects stole printer ink from the Target located at 1751 University Drive, in the city of Vista. The total loss was \$1072.75. There have been similar thefts from other Targets throughout Orange County and San Diego County. The suspects were seen leaving the location in a dark colored SUV.

SUSPECTS:

S1: Black male adult, 25-35 years old, with short black hair and a black mustache. He was wearing a green Eagles football hooded sweater, blue jeans, and blue shoes.

S2: Black female adult, 25-40 years old, with long black hair pulled back. She was wearing a blue sweater, black pants, and white tennis shoes.

S3: Black male adult, 25-35 years old, with a black mustache. He was wearing a blue Tommy Hilfiger hooded sweater, blue jeans, and black tennis shoes.




